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#### **Congressional Reporting Requirements**



#### Audit-Related Provisions in P.L. 118-31, the NDAA for FY 2024

- Title IX, Sec. 920 Operationalizing Audit Readiness: SECDEF and military departments develop audit remediation goals and metrics to measure progress, evaluate how those metrics can be used in performance evaluations, and brief committees.
- Title X, Sec. 1004 Audit Requirement for DoD Components:

  Any component that fails to be subject to audit during any fiscal year shall have 1.5 percent of unobligated amounts available be cancelled.
- Title X, Sec. 1005a Requirement for Unqualified Opinion: SECDEF to ensure DoD has received an *unqualified opinion by 31 December 2028.*
- Title X, Sec. 1061 Reporting Modifications: Eliminates March 31 Audit Results Report.
   Extends due date of CAP Funding Report to 10 days following submission of the President's Budget. Moves the due date the FIAR Report and semiannual corrective action plan briefing from 30 June to 31 July. Removes audit services ratio reporting requirement.
- Title XI, Sec. 1413 DLA Transaction Fund: Establishes beginning balances for the DLA NDSTF Fund Balance With Treasury, Total Actual Resources – Collected and Unapportioned – Unexpired Authority.

Note: Resulting changes to U.S. Code are still pending.

#### **Secretary of Defense (SECDEF) Memorandums**



In FY2024, the Secretary of Defense issued two significant audit related memorandums:

#### **Expectations for Supporting Department of Defense Financial Statement Audits**(Signed 13 October 2023)

- Outlines SECDEF expectations of principal staff assistants (PSAs) for accelerating audit progress.
- Implementation plan for expectations due to DSD by 1 March.
- Areas of focus vary by PSA and each PSA has defined measures of success.
- SES members shall include all SECEF audit priority goals in individual performance plans.
- Audit progress will be considered in the PPBE POM process.
- Service organizations shall maximize use of Advana to support PSAs.

#### **FY 2024 Financial Statement Audit Priorities**

(Signed 30 November 2023)

- Calls for continued pursuit of prior year priorities (i.e., Improve Fund Balance with Treasury, Strengthen Internal Control Environment, and Create a Universe of Transactions).
- Adds a fourth priority of Optimizing Asset Valuations.
- Specifies goals and KPIs for Components to use in tracking progress.
- OUSD(C) to submit report on alternatives for valuing assets acquired as part of Major Defense Acquisition Programs and Major Weapon Systems to DSD by 30 September.
- January 2024 deadline for Components to report plans for achieving priority goals.

#### **Summary of DoD-Wide Audit Results**

#### Fiscal Year 2023 Audit Results

- The audit was comprised of 29 standalone audits and one Consolidated audit. In FY 2023, there was no change in component audit results (other than the two new audits).
- Two new audits started in FY 2023, Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) and Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA); both received disclaimers.
- The results of the USMC audit is not yet known.
- Favorable opinions are estimated to cover 50 percent of the Department's assets. This does not mean that the other 50 percent is unaccounted for.

#### **DoD-Wide Material Weaknesses**

 No new DoD-wide material weaknesses (MWs) were reported resulting in no net change in the overall number of MWs

#### **DoD Audit Strategy – Looking Ahead**

- The 2024 NDAA legislative requirement for the Department to achieve an unmodified audit opinion by 2028 provides an opportunity to reexamine our current audit strategy.
  - The Department is revisiting the audit approach, and accompanying remediation strategy efforts, through a lens of simplification, costs savings, and growing auditability based on materiality and impact – to drive increased demonstrable audit progress.


